Statement of Significance: (non-statutory summary)

Why is it significant?:

The Heritage Council may enter a place in the Heritage Register if it meets one or more of the following criteria from the Historic Cultural Heritage Act 1995:

- a) The place is important to the course or pattern of Tasmania's history.
- b) The place possesses uncommon or rare aspects of Tasmania's history.
- c) The place has the potential to yield information that will contribute to an understanding of Tasmania's history.
- d) The place is important in demonstrating the principal characteristics of a class of place in Tasmania's history.

Dungrove is of historic heritage significance because of its ability to demonstrate the principal characteristics of a sandstone Federation Queen Anne domestic building. The early cottage has the ability to demonstrate the principal characteristics of an early sandstone house and the Shearing shed is able to demonstrate the growth and development of a nineteenth century rural building.

- g) The place has a special association with the life or works of a person, or group of persons, of importance in Tasmania's history.

Description:

This is a farm site consisting of three significant buildings, an early Georgian sandstone cottage featuring a central door and flanking double hung window, dormer windows and a Dutch gabled roof, a Federation Queen Anne homestead featuring three projecting gables, one on each sides and a third on the diagonal corner over a verandah, the walls are rough hewn sandstone quarried nearby, the roof a primary hip with projecting gables and skillion dormers, the third building on the site is an early shearing shed with numerous additions and extensions. The shearing shed is a strong visual element of the site.
