Original dated 5 October 2012	1. The person taking the action must not clear more than 8.2 ha of habitat for Black Cockatoos that is in 'good' to 'very good' condition as identified in
	<u>Attachment B</u> , within the project area identified at <u>Attachment A</u>
Original dated 5 October 2012	2. To offset the loss of 8.2 ha of Black Cockatoo foraging habitat and the loss of 19 potential breeding trees, the person taking the action must:
	a. Within 12 months of the commencement of construction undertake direct planting of at least 80 tree plant species that are known to be Black Cockatoo breeding species within the POS areas shown at <u>Attachment B</u> . Planting must be completed within 2 years after the commencement of construction . After 2 years of the completion of planting, a survival rate of at least 80% must be attained, or a minimum of 80 trees surviving. If this survival rate is not attained, replanting must be undertaken within 12 months of the 2 year anniversary, to attain an 80% survival rate (or a minimum of 80 trees).
	b. Within 12 months of commencement of construction undertake direct replanting of a minimum of 200 trees that that are known to be Black Cockatoo foraging species , within streetscaping. The planting of the trees must be completed within 10 years from commencement of construction . After two years of completion of planting, an 80% survival rate must be obtained. If this is not obtained, replanting of trees must be undertaken within 12 months of the 2 year anniversary, to gain an 80% survival rate.
	c. Within 12 months of the commencement of construction, provide funding of \$100,000 to WA DEC for the acquisition, and to assist in the ongoing maintenance of, a 100 ha area of freehold land in the Gingin area, to offset the loss of 8.2 ha of Black Cockatoo habitat. The land being ceded to WA DEC must contain <i>Banksia</i> woodland that is in equivalent or better condition than the Banksia woodland that is in 'good' to 'very good' condition within the project area. Within 4 weeks of the funding being provided to WA DEC, the person taking the action must provide written evidence to the department of the payment.
